Got Gadget?

No gun fight was ever won with a fast re-holster. Holstering the pistol is one of those activities which can and should be done taking every possible precaution.

If you're running a hammer-fired pistol, it's prudent when holstering to place your thumb firmly on the hammer to prevent its movement. Of course the indispensable precaution when holstering is to keep your booger hook off the trigger. But you must also take care that the trigger is not snagged by clothing, a retention strap or anything else that might find its way into the trigger guard. Firmly pressing the hammer is an extra measure of safety against the possibility that a foreign object has found its way into the trigger guard.

Of course you can't do that with striker-fired pistols. Until now... Soon this precaution will be possible with a Glock.

The Gadget Striker Control Device (developed and patented by Tom Jones and renowned trainer Todd Green) is a hinged plate that replaces the fixed plate at the back of the Glock slide.

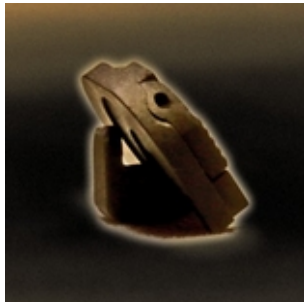

It is completely passive. It does not lock or otherwise interfere with the action unless physical force is purposely applied. In a firing grip the Gadget is not engaged and your Glock operates normally with no additional steps needed in the presentation. But when thumb pressure is applied, the Gadget blocks the motion of the striker overcoming any pressure being applied to the trigger.

IMAO installing this device is a no-brainer for anyone who holsters a Glock, and perhaps especially so for police officers who have to wear Bat Belts and fiddle with retention holsters.
