And for the first time this year, anybody anywhere at all can go online to purchase each and every package and table we offer. They don't need to find a committee member.

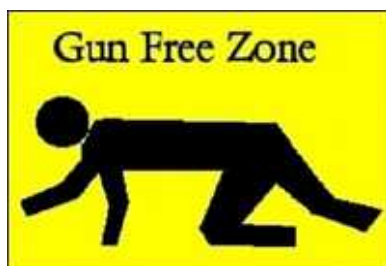
Consider too that the Early Bird raffle Deadline this year is February 5th. Those of you who got in last year will remember Dan raffled off a firearm for the early birds.

"Everyone dropped to the floor," Denise Peraza, 27, told her relatives. "The guys opened fire for 30 seconds, randomly, then paused to reload and began firing again."

Not all CLEO's are afraid to state the obvious. Van Blarcum, Sheriff of Ulster County (New York): "In light of recent events that have occurred in the United States and around the world I want to encourage citizens of



Ulster County who are licensed to carry a firearm to PLEASE DO SO." Nor was he the only one. I could fill this page with such statements by Sheriffs and police chiefs across the country. Sheriff Hart, call your office!

A fellow by the name of Davi Barker analyzed the ten most recent mass shootings that were stopped (he excluded shootings in which the perpetrator shot and immediately left). He calculated that average number of people killed in mass shootings when stopped by police is 18.25 but the average number of people killed in a mass shooting when stopped by civilians is 2.2. He was criticized for using too small a sample, so he analyzed 100 interrupted mass shootings. He found that the average number of people killed in mass shootings when stopped by police is 14.29, whereas the average number of people killed in a mass shooting when stopped by a civilian is 2.33. Makes sense when you think about it. Not only do the police arrive some time after the shooting starts, but if they just rush in they risk leaving an exit for the killer, getting shot because the killer is somewhere in a crowd, and because unlike the victims they don't know who the killer is, shooting innocents.

Bass Derby News

Two Best Bass Team Tournament Rules

- Sign in time will be ½ hour before start time.
- Entry fee \$20 per boat, and \$5 big fish option per person.
- Max 3 people per boat, each must have a valid CA fishing license if over the age of 15.
- There must be one active member per boat.
- Guests are limited to 3 visits on the property.
- Live wells are mandatory and will be checked at sign-in.
- Late comers must find tournament director to sign-in before fishing.

- The order in which you sign-in will determine the order in which you will be released.
- There will be a 10mph speed limit for the first ½ hour, and 25mph after that.
- Pre-fishing one day before the tournament is not allowed.
- Artificial baits only.
- 12" minimum length, measured on a WIL-E-GO flat board.
- Dead fish will not be weighed.
- Please have required Coast Guard safety equipment on board.
